The Post Bulletin allows families to submit an obituary in story form and it will be appear in the newspaper the way it is submitted (minor editing may happen at the Post Bulletin if they see fit.) The current cost is \$110.00. Any obituaries over 350 words will have additional charges. The Post Bulletin will also include 10 copies to you at no additional charge. A picture can be included with no extra charge. If any mention of military service is in the obituary, a flag will also be added to the obituary at no extra charge.

Mr. Stellbaum, 91, of Shoreview, MN, formerly of Rochester, died Tuesday (May 18, 2013) at his residence. John was born December 29, 1918 in St. Charles, MN to James and Linda Wellham Stellbaum.

He graduated from St. Charles High School in 1936. On October 7, 1940 he married Lois L. Harrison at The Little Brown Church in Nashua, Iowa. The couple lived in Rochester until 1987, when they moved to Mesa, Arizona. In 1998 they moved to Spring Lake Park, MN. In 2003, John moved to Shoreview, MN after the passing of his wife. John worked as a mechanic for Harold's Auto Electric for 37 years.

Survivors include his two daughters, Sharon Bendelow of Shoreview, MN, and Barbara (Gary) Ellingson of LaBolt, SD, a son Robert of Las Vegas, Nevada; six grandchildren; ten great grandchildren on one great-great granddaughter. He is preceded in death by his wife, one sister and one granddaughter.

John loved wood-carving, camping, fishing and especially working on his 1968 Chevrolet Corvette with his grandchildren.
